The Green Room This facility enables students to have additional support (e.g. with coursework, preparation for assessments, Maths and English intervention) whilst also accessing some aspects of their GCSEs in class. Many of the students using this facility are on reduced timetables. The Green Room is staffed by a full time member of support staff who has significant experience of working with vulnerable and sometimes challenging students. Teaching staff from key subject areas or those with specific skills working with challenging students are timetabled for some lessons in the Room.
