


Crime and Punishment Year 5 Autumn Term 1



Thematic Areas of Learning

As **Scientists**, we will be studying the properties of materials. We will learn specific scientific vocabulary around properties and test material's properties to determine their uses.

As **Historians**, we will be studying crime and punishment from the Anglo-Saxon times to now, understanding how punishments have changed over the years and how some crimes, like playing football, are now considered to be normal, everyday activities.

As **Artists**, we will be practising our sketching skills by creating E-Fit (mugshot) pictures using descriptions of different characters. We will use pastels to recreate scenes from courtroom pictures. We will also answer the question, "Graffiti, is it art or vandalism?" where we will look at work from graffiti artists such as Banksy and discuss resident's viewpoints.

English

This term we will focus on gaining a deep understanding of sentences and the types of clauses which they can be made up of. Pupils will understand the different types of conjunctions used to connect these clauses and when and how to use these correctly within a sentence.

These skills will then be applied in our narrative writing where we build and connect different types of sentences together.

Maths

Place Value – We will learn the value of each digit and compare numbers to determine whether they are smaller or larger than each other.

Roman Numerals – We will learn the Roman numerals to 1000 and translate between Roman numerals and our Arabic number system.

4 Operations – We will be learning efficient methods for multiplying, dividing, adding and subtracting.

Religious Education

We will be learning how Hindu worship by considering the key question: What is the best way for a Hindu to show commitment to God?

Physical Education

We will be studying football this term. As well as understanding the laws of the game, we will be developing our passing, dribbling, shooting and goalkeeping skills. All of these skills will be applied in small game situations.

Computing

We will begin our computing lessons by understanding how to remain safe on the internet. We will learn the terms 'copyright' and 'plagiarism', where to go for help, and how to use privacy settings.

French

Madame Rawlings will be teaching French this year. We will be learning about important aspects of French culture, like the Tour de France. We will be working on our pronunciation of French words by recapping colours and greetings.

Music

As **musicians** we will listen and reflect on a piece of orchestral music, invent our own musical motifs and structure them in a piece whilst learning musical language appropriate to the task.

PSHE

We will be learning about everyone being different and how our worlds look differently. We will talk about different countries and how their world is different to ours.

Character

We will be developing our growth mindsets by learning that mistakes are how we improve and get better. We will also develop a clear marking and feedback cycle as a class.

Coaching

We will set targets that we want to achieve in Year 5. Over the course of the year we will return to these targets and evaluate how we are meeting them.

Communities

Within PSHE we will look at other communities and how they are different to ours. We will think about what it would be like to live there and the things that we take for granted in our lives.

Conservation

Our eco councillors will be elected this term and we will be holding our first eco council meetings in class. We will discuss how we can impact the environment one person at a time.

Curiosity

Within history lessons, we will choose our own areas of Crime and Punishment to research and present to the rest of the class.
