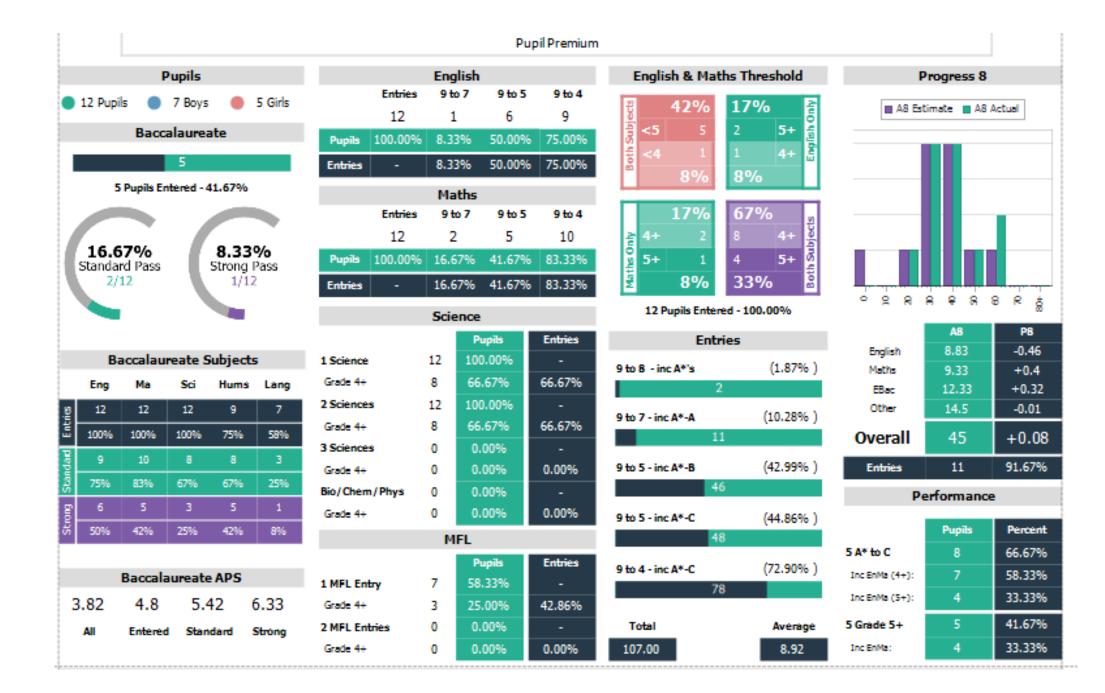

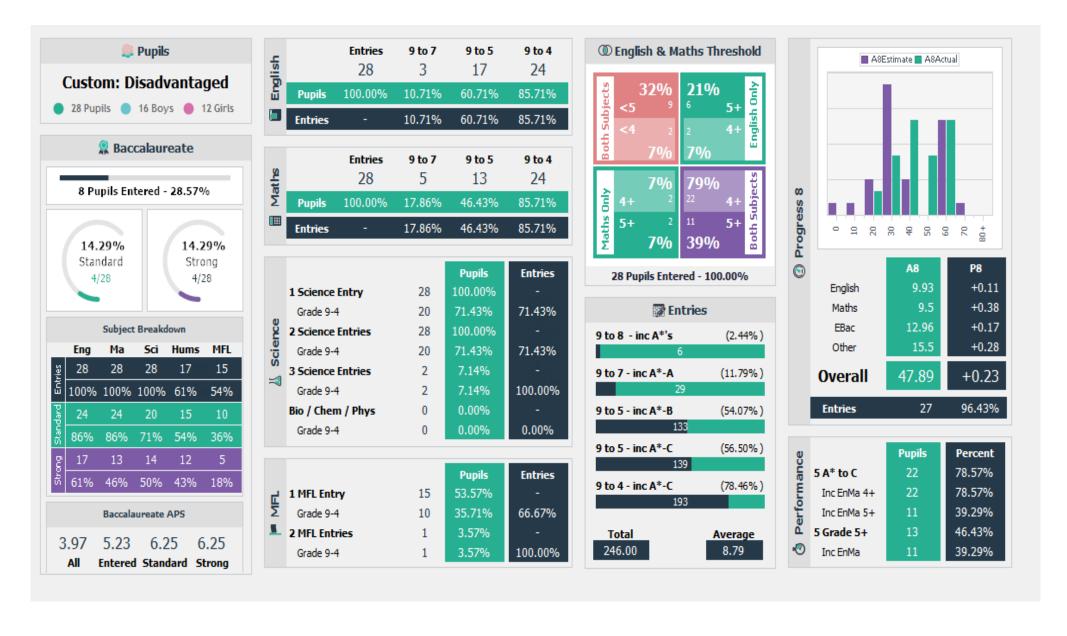

A Key priority for use remains the levels of attendance and persistent absentees in our disadvantaged cohort

Addressing Basic Needs Removing Barriers to Attendance & Learning

- o Tutor Mentoring scheme for all year groups
- o 6th form Mentors to support with transition

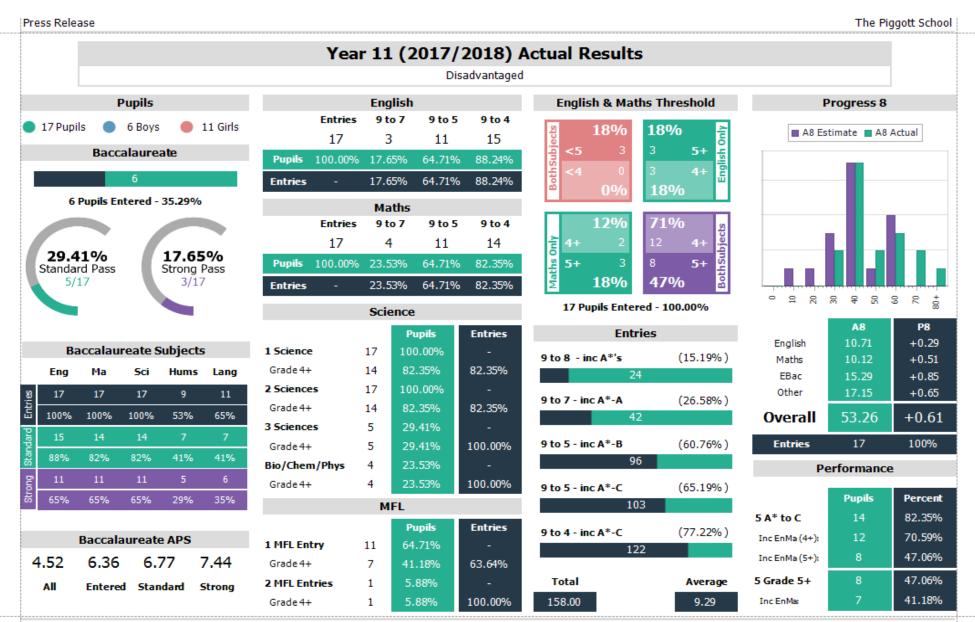

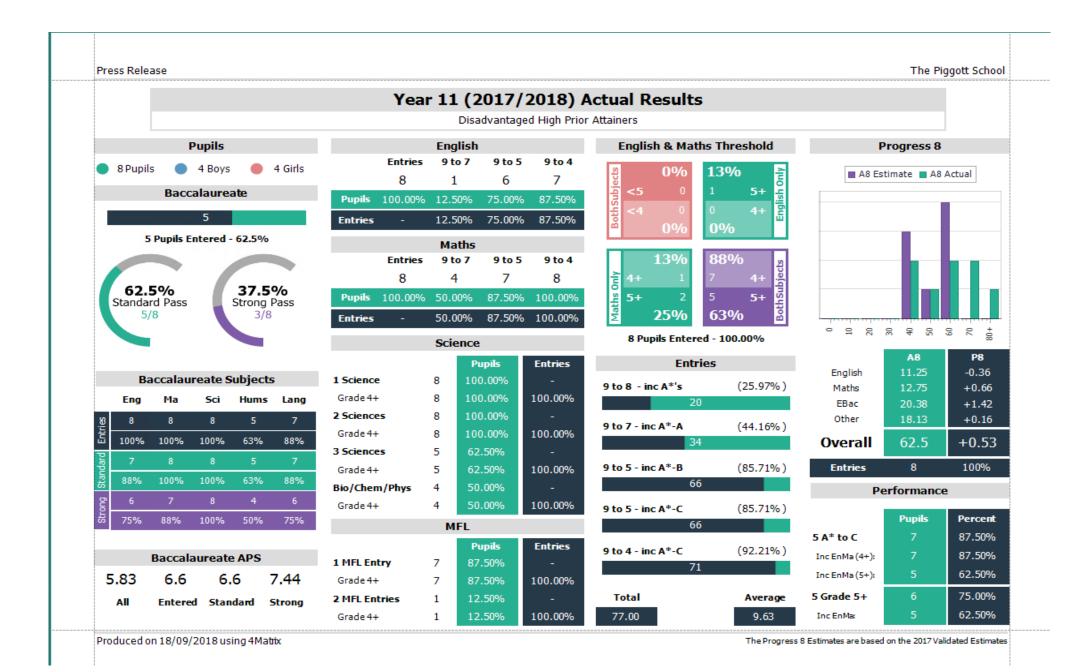
