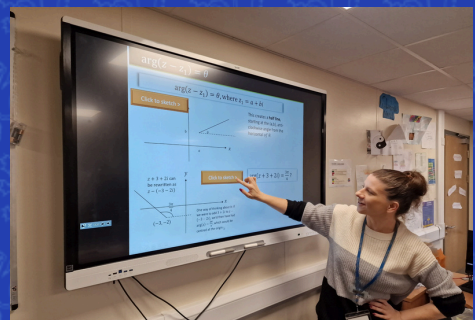

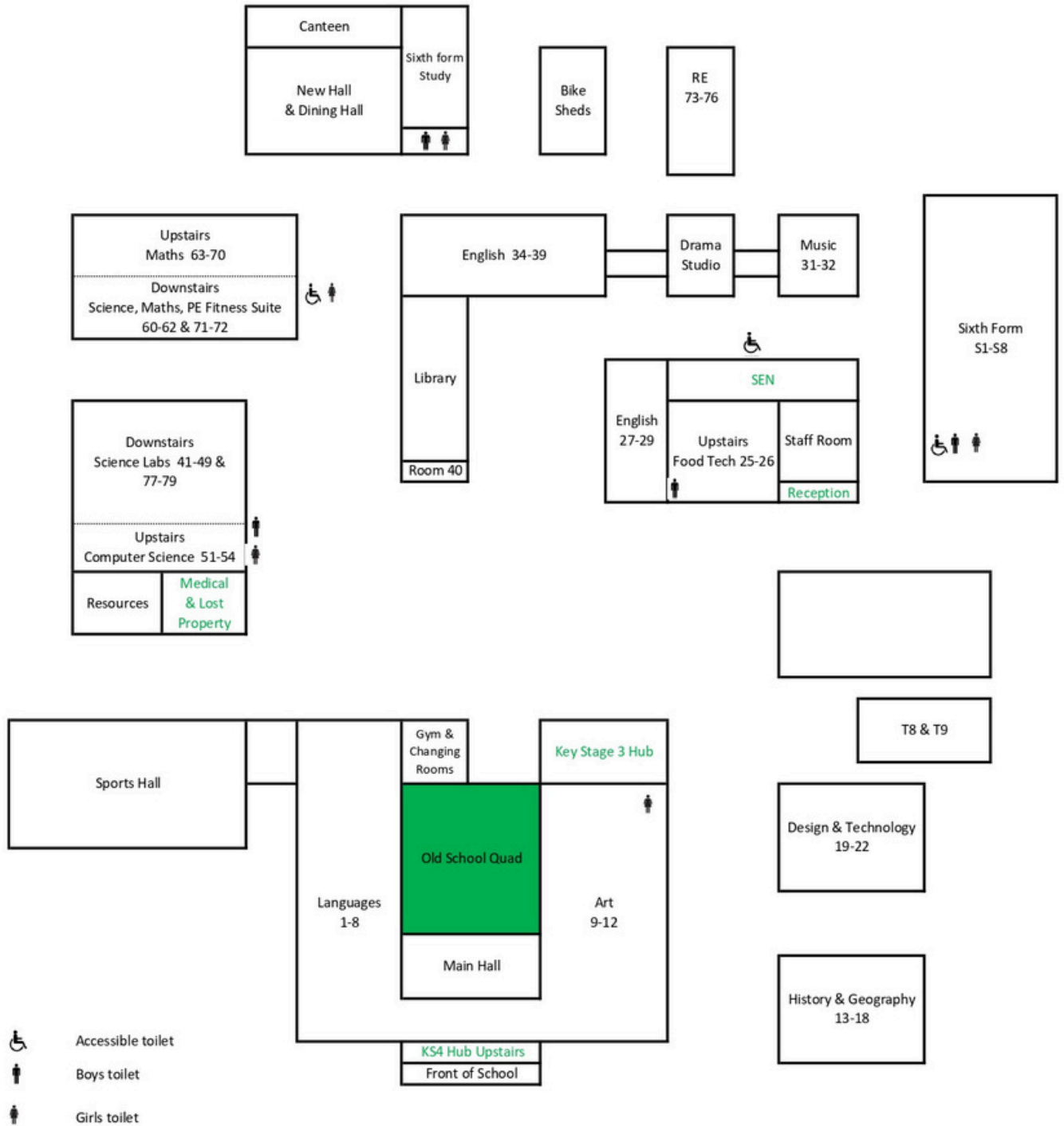

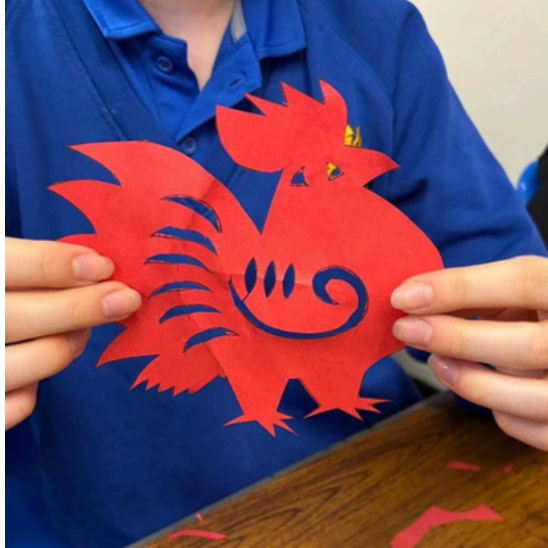

MERITS

If you do something that is particularly good, for example, a piece of work or playing in a school team etc., your teacher will award you a merit on Satchel One. Bronze, silver, gold and platinum certificates are presented at the end of each term, depending on how many merits you have collected.

Good behaviour, effort, work, punctuality and attendance are also celebrated in assembly at the end of each term.

You and your parents can monitor your merits, behaviour points and attendance via the Satchel One app.

MOBILE PHONES

For students in Year 7 to Year 11, mobile phones are only permitted for the journey to and from school, but they must be switched off and in bags for the duration of the school day.

BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

At The Piggott School, we believe that positive behaviour is essential for a calm, safe, and successful learning environment. Our school values – courage, respect, honesty, dedication, equality, and love – guide how we behave and treat one another, both in and out of the classroom.

We have clear expectations so that everyone understands how to behave responsibly and respectfully. Students are encouraged to take pride in their learning, support each other, and take ownership of their actions. Positive behaviour is regularly recognised and rewarded by staff, helping to create a culture where effort and kindness are celebrated.

If things go wrong, we focus on reflection and learning from mistakes. Our aim is always to support students in making better choices and developing the confidence to succeed.

At The Piggott School, we are proud of the way our students behave, contribute to the school community, and live out the values that help everyone to achieve their best.



ABSENCE & PUNCTUALITY

If you are absent from school, your parents must contact the school explaining the reason why. A message can be left on the school answer phone, or some parents may choose to text the school via School Comms. The reason is then marked in the class register, which is checked each week by the attendance panel.

It is important that you arrive promptly for school. If you are late and arrive during tutor time, you must sign in at your Key Stage office. If you arrive after tutor time, you must sign in at Reception. This is very important for health and safety.

If you have a medical or dental appointment during school hours, your parents should contact the school so it can be recorded on the register. Always sign out at Reception when leaving school early or arriving late.

If you need to call your parents in the day, go to reception or medical and they will help you. do not use your mobile phone.

HOMEWORK

Homework is set regularly by all teachers. Satchel One is the central online resource which is used by teachers to assign homework and upload lesson resources. You and your parents can download the Satchel One app to monitor this information.

You will be provided with a user login to this platform when you start, and we encourage you to use it for accessing all resources.

CANTEEN

Cooked meals and snacks are served in the canteen. You are allowed to take food out of the canteen and find an alternative venue to eat if you wish.

We encourage all pupils to follow a healthy lifestyle. Please do not bring fizzy, sugary, or energy drinks to school.

Our school operates a cashless canteen system via ParentPay, using secure, modern technology that removes the need for pupils to carry cash. In September, each pupil will receive a tap-and-go card linked to their individual account. Parents and carers can add funds to a student's account at any time. The cost of food and drink is deducted automatically each day. A default daily spend limit of £6 is applied to all accounts; however, this can be adjusted for individual students upon written request to the School Finance Office.



PAYMENTS

To top up a child's canteen account, please make an online payment using the ParentPay link available on the school website.

Paying for School Trips and Equipment
Additional payments—including those for school trips, tours, textbooks and equipment—can be made via the Scopay Online Payment System.

Full instructions, along with your child's unique activation codes for both ParentPay and Scopay, will be provided.

BREAK, LUNCHTIME & AFTERSCHOOL ACTIVITIES

You are normally expected to be out of the school buildings during break, unless the "wet weather" bell is rung. Snacks are sold in the canteen throughout the break period and from an outside kiosk. Ball games are allowed on the 3G and on the field in summer. Ball games in the playground are not allowed for safety reasons.

There are some clubs that are run during lunchtimes- your tutors will have an up-to-date list that they will share with your termly.

Most letters home will be sent by email but occasionally your tutor will also give you important letters to pass to your parents. It is very important that these letters reach your parents. Please accept this as your responsibility.

ASSEMBLIES

Each year group has two assemblies a week and these are held in the Main Hall and the Gym. You will be accompanied to the assembly venue by your tutor after the register has been called.

Please remember that assemblies are formal occasions.

* **Football Boots** – All pupils will need a pair of moulded stud boots to be able to use the new astro turf. Conventional football boots with screw in metal studs are not acceptable and will damage the pitch.

ADDITIONAL OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Plain Navy or Black Tracksuit bottoms – to be worn at the discretion of the PE Teacher. A recommended purchase if participating in school fixtures.
- Mouthguard (strongly recommended by the Rugby Football Union)



NOT ALLOWED

- Alternative jumpers, cardigans or hoodies.
- "Fashion" boots, trainers, high heels or canvas shoes.
- Jewellery other than a single stud in each ear.
- Make-up.
- Extreme hairstyles and colours, (to include patterns shaved into hair).

EQUIPMENT

ORGANISATION

You have to carry all your books with you because you move around the school to different subject areas. Choose a bag that is not too large, waterproof, and will protect your books. Make sure it is labelled with your name. Don't leave valuables in your bag.



LOCKERS

You can hire a locker to keep your possessions in, such as your coat, PE kit, books, etc. These will be allocated in September.



LOST PROPERTY

If you have lost something, first check with student services to see if it has been handed in to lost property.

PAYMENT SYSTEMS

CANTEEN ACCOUNTS

If your child will be using the canteen, you will need to set up a ParentPay account. ParentPay allows you to top up funds quickly and securely so your child can purchase food on site. If you haven't yet received account details, please contact the Finance Team at finance@piggottschool.org, and they will be happy to help.

Students must bring their Tap & Go cards to school each day, as these are linked to their ParentPay accounts and are required for purchasing food. Bringing the card daily ensures smooth service and quick access to meals.

There is a default daily spending limit of £6 on each student's account. This can be changed at any time by emailing the Finance Office, who will be happy to amend the limit for you.

If a student's ParentPay balance is insufficient, they will automatically receive a loan equivalent to one main meal deal. Any further purchases will require the student to collect a red card, and parents will be contacted. To avoid interruptions, please ensure accounts are topped up regularly. You can also set up a free low-balance email alert through ParentPay to help you stay informed.

PARENT PAY

Parent Pay is the platform used to make payments for school meal accounts and printing credits. Parents will be sent a letter with instructions on setting up an account in July 2026

SCOPAY

Scopay is the platform used to make payments for school trips and other events. Parents will be sent a letter with instructions on setting up an account in July 2026

TRAVELLING TO SCHOOL

CYCLING

All students riding a bicycle to school should wear a cycle helmet at all times. Cyclists should wear light coloured and highly visual outer clothing. Students who cycle must use the side entrances to enter the school site rather than the main school gates which cars use. All cycles must be left in the cycle compound and secured with an efficient locking device. The gates of the compound are locked at 9.15am and are opened again at the end of school. All cycles may be subject to inspection by the Police for road worthiness.

WALKING

All students are expected to behave sensibly and with respect when walking to and from school. We expect students to use the footbridge when crossing the A4 and ask they enter the school site by the side entrances rather than the main vehicle entrance gates for safety reasons.

BY CAR

We encourage students to cycle, walk or take public transport to school. Where driving is the only option, car shares or dropping children away from the main school site (so they have a short walk to school) are preferred. When dropping off, or picking up from school, drivers are asked to drop in the designated areas and follow the 'snake' path around the mini roundabout. Gates will open to parents at 2.45pm.



YEAR 7 SUBJECTS



ENGLISH

Reading is really important, and there is a wide range of books in the Library for you to borrow. Reading challenges and competitions allow you to compete for prizes based on your reading.

English lessons are designed to take you on a journey through literature across time, so you will get to experience a wide range of texts and authors.



SCIENCE

We do lots of safe practical lessons - these make Science fun.

You'll learn something new about the world in every lesson.

It's good to ask questions about what you learn in Science.

MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGES

At The Piggott students study French and one other language, either Spanish, German or Mandarin.

If you have French on your timetable, you will build on any prior knowledge that you already have and develop your skills in listening, speaking, reading and writing.

If you have Spanish or German as well, you will start with the basics like key sounds, words that look similar to English words, numbers, describing yourself, etc.

To support your learning, we will use a number of online applications and tools such as Duolingo, Memrise and Quizlet.



MATHS

We will always start with what you know. Maths can be challenging, but will be lots of fun!

It does not matter if you do not know the answer, as long as you are trying hard to work it out.

Times tables and number bonds are important, so keep practising!



PRE (PHILOSOPHY, RELIGION & ETHICS)

You will learn about the six major world religions.

You will explore the School's Christian vision from the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

You will engage in big critical questions on philosophy and ethics.



YEAR 7 SUBJECTS



GEOGRAPHY

You will start the course by learning about the seven natural wonders of the world and how people interact with them.

We focus on developing your geographical skills throughout the year, such as map-reading, using an atlas and learning about GIS (Geographical Information Systems).

We encourage all students to get involved, share their knowledge and support the learning of others.



DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

In Year 7 & 8, there are three projects in different material areas - Electronics, Materials (wood and plastic) and Graphics.

You will learn how to work safely, how to solve problems and design creative products.

You will learn how to design and make functional products by developing practical skills such as soldering, marking out, using hand tools to cut and shape materials.

FOOD TECHNOLOGY

In year 7 and 8 you will cook and taste a range of dishes whilst learning about healthy eating and having a varied diet.

You will learn the following skills: weighing and measuring, hygiene and safety rules, precision cutting, peeling, grating, making doughs, sauces and batters.

You will be expected to organise your ingredients at home, by weighing and measuring accurately. You will need to bring in suitable containers to transport your food, to and from home.



HISTORY

You will start the course by looking at the Vikings. You will then move on to focus on The Middle Ages, beginning with the Battle of Hastings in 1066.

In the Autumn Term you will study lots of interesting things, including castles and a famous murder!

We do lots of work in groups, and we love it when students have a lot to say about History.



DRAMA

You will learn about drama strategies, medium and elements to create performance work.

You will build in confidence, working with others (team work), and experiment with creative choices - using your imagination.



YEAR 7 SUBJECTS



ART

Lessons will be based around exciting projects, encouraging you to explore the world around you.

You will be encouraged to work and experiment with a variety of materials such as oil pastels, paint, printmaking, clay and collage.

The majority of your materials will be provided, but please make sure you have a 2B pencil, rubber and pencil sharpener before your first lesson.



COMPUTER SCIENCE

In Computer Science, it's not all about what you know but also how you use your knowledge to solve problems.

Programming, and knowledge of how computers work and communicate, will be the two main aspects of your Computer Science lessons.

In lessons, we will learn how to use computing skills in the future, in any career of your choice.



PE

During your first year at The Piggott, you will participate in a number of different sports, which include: football, rugby, netball, handball, cricket, athletics, rounders, softball, basketball, badminton, short tennis, dance, gymnastics, outdoor adventurous activities, fitness & lifestyle lessons.

You will be assessed through our Head, Heart & Hands assessment model. Some of the concepts we focus on include: tactical awareness, leadership, respect, confidence, technique & competitiveness.

Lots of co-curricular clubs will be on offer throughout the year, following the curriculum sports.



MUSIC

If you have instrumental or vocal lessons in primary school (e.g. piano, guitar, violin, singing lessons), you should be able to continue with these at The Piggott. Coming here is also a good time to consider starting to learn an instrument if you have not done so before.

In class, you will take part in a variety of group practical activities including singing, creating your own music and performing.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



WHAT DO I DO ON MY FIRST DAY OF YEAR 7?

Your first day is Wednesday 2nd September. Year 7 and Year 12 will be in the only students in school that day. You should come to the playground for 8.30am where your tutor will meet you and take you to your tutor base. You will have an extended tutor time where you will be given your timetable, and your tutor will go through any questions you have. You will then attend the rest of your timetabled lessons for that day. Don't worry if you've got PE on that day- you won't be expected to have your kit with you.



WHAT DO I DO IF I DON'T KNOW ANYONE IN MY TUTOR GROUP OR CLASSES?

Try not to worry if you don't know anyone- most students will be in the same position. Your teachers will put you into seating plans for your lessons and will organise tasks to help people get to know each other. You will be able to meet up with friends at breaks and lunchtime. Your Head of Year will also organise some activities for anyone that wants to meet new people at breaks and lunchtimes. If you are worried or lonely you can always speak to your tutor and they can help you.



WHO DO I SPEAK TO IF I HAVE A QUESTION OR WORRY?

The best person to speak to in the first instance is your tutor. You will see them every morning and they will get to know you well. If you need to see someone during the day you can go to the Key Stage 3 Hub. If you have a worry at break or lunchtime there will be teachers on the playground and fields that you can talk to. If you are unsure of where to go you can see the friendly ladies in Reception who will help you.



WHAT DO I DO IF I FORGET MY HOMEWORK OR DON'T UNDERSTAND MY HOMEWORK?

Homework is set on Satchel One so you need to check the details and due dates on there. You can download the Satchel app to your phone or computer at home. If you don't understand the homework you can speak to the teacher or email them and ask for help. You will need to be organised so that you don't leave this until the last minute. If you forget your homework, you need to tell the teacher. You may be given a detention depending on the circumstances but the teachers are fair and will talk to you about what has happened.



WHAT IF I NEED THE TOILET OR WANT TO FILL UP MY WATER BOTTLE DURING LESSONS?

Students are not permitted to go to the toilet or to fill up their water bottles during lessons unless they have a 'toilet pass' which is given to those with a medical need. Students should organise themselves so they use the bathroom or water machines at breaks and lunchtimes.

TOP TIPS FROM OUR CURRENT YEAR 7 STUDENTS

Don't worry about asking teachers or other students for help.

Be prepared to make new friends and don't forget your old ones.

When possible, do your homework on the day it is set. That way you will be able to organise yourself.

Don't worry about getting lost – never be afraid to ask for help from a teacher – they don't bite, honest!

Make sure you are fully equipped for your lessons.

Be organised with your PE kit, your homework and your food technology ingredients. Use your locker to help you.

Make new friends by going to clubs and enjoy all the extra activities available to you.

Be smartly dressed and wear your uniform with pride.

Remember this is an opportunity to start afresh – make the most of it!

We were in your position this time last year, so there is no need to worry; you will settle into The Piggott School very quickly.
