Foundation - Bread Making

What's in the box?


Today it was a slice of bread!





We all like bread, but where does it come from? We remembered learning about where food comes from. Bread is made from wheat, which is made from a plant which is grown on farms. We learned how the wheat is made into flour, which is then mixed with other ingredients and baked to make bread.





We all worked together to add the ingredients to the bread maker to make bread.

A really important ingredient is yeast — it looks like sand, but if you mix it in warm water and give it some sugar it gets excited and makes bubbles which is what makes the bread so nice and soft and fluffy. We did an experiment to test this out. We put some bread dough into a cup and marked the level. We left it on the window sill and by lunchtime the dough had doubled in size! We also mixed some yeast in a bottle with water, sugar and salt and put a balloon over the neck of the bottle to catch the gas coming out of the bubbles. By lunchtime the balloon had started to inflate!






Our bread looked great and tasted amazing, and we could see all the little bubbles, made by the yeast, that made it so soft and tasty.

The children really enjoyed meeting them and trying out their French vocabulary.







My Journey Wokingham Update

Charvil Piggott Primary School has recently become an Air Quality School and the My Journey Wokingham team are monitoring NO₂ levels around the school using diffusion tubes. Very early data collected so far has shown that the NO₂ levels around the school site is at a low level, however more data needs to be collected by the Wokingham Air Quality Project to provide a clearer picture up until the end of the project in October 2023. However at Twyford Crossroads, an Air Quality Management Area was declared in 2015 (DEFRA link - https://uk-air.defra.gov.uk/aqma/details?aqma_ref=1601#1108)

This is an area where the air quality has been assessed and the levels of nitrogen dioxide, a pollutant that occurs from vehicle exhaust emissions, exceed the National Air Quality Objective. We all need to do our part by choosing active (walk, scoot, cycle) or sustainable travel (bus, train) for short journeys when travelling around Twyford.



Year 5 & 6 Football Tournament


