

## GCSEs

# GCSEs

GCSE stands for General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE).

It is an academic qualification in a range of particular subjects, taken in England, Wales, and Northern Ireland.

Studies for GCSE examinations take place over a period of three academic years starting in Year 9 at The Piggott School with examinations being sat at the end of Year 11.

# **GCSE Grades**

In England, GCSEs are now graded using a numerical system from 9 to 1.

9 is the best grade possible.

Students will have needed a 4 for a "standard pass" and 5 for a "strong pass".

Many sixth forms insist on a minimum point score as a condition of entry for further study.

### Choosing GCSE Options at The Piggott School

#### **Compulsory Subjects:**

- English Literature and Language
- Maths
- Science Double or Triple
- Religious Studies GCSE (in keeping with the Christian Values and Character of our School)

- PSHE- No qualification
- Core PE- No qualification

# English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

The EBacc is not a qualification in its own right – it's a combination of GCSE subjects, including a language, that offer an important range of knowledge and skills to young people.

EBacc is made up of:

- ✓ English
- ✓ mathematics
- ✓ history or geography
- $\checkmark$  the sciences including computer science
- $\checkmark$  a modern foreign language

Students must choose at least one, preferably two, EBacc subjects.

EBacc at GCSE gives students access to a full range of employment options when they leave secondary school and the broad knowledge that employers are looking for.

# The GCSE Options Process

Students will then choose **four** full course GCSE/Level 2 courses from the following list:

- Art & Design GCSE
- Business GCSE
- Chinese GCSE
- Computer Science GCSE
- Design & Technology GCSE
- Drama GCSE
- Food Preparation & Nutrition GCSE
- French GCSE
- Further Maths Level 2 & Statistics GCSE
- Geography GCSE

- History GCSE
- Media Studies GCSE
- Music GCSE
- Photography GCSE
- Physical Education GCSE
- Spanish GCSE

### Taking a GCSE in a student's first language

Students can take a GCSE exam in their first language, depending on the language.

These GCSE exams are in addition to the student's GCSE options.

E.g. a student whose first language is Chinese does not need to opt for Chinese GCSE. They can just do the exam.

These exams normally take place in Year 10.

Parents will be approached about this option in Year 9 by Mr. MacLeod, or by language staff

# **Final Remarks**

- ✓ Students must choose one, preferably two, EBacc subjects
- ✓ Students are strongly advised to choose a modern foreign language
- ✓ Staffing issues and class size constraints mean that students will need to select a reserve option. This might replace one of your other choices if your choice combination is not possible
- $\checkmark$  If this happens, we will discuss this with the student
- ✓ The Piggott School try to provide students with all their option choices, and, unlike many schools, we offer a free  $\checkmark$  This reserve choice is to be included on the Options choice to all
- $\checkmark$  The option blocks are built after students have made their choices rather than before
- Preference form as a 5<sup>th</sup> choice
